Responsibilities and Qualifications

The University of the Ozarks invites applications for a current opening as a tenure-track Assistant or Associate Professor of Education beginning August, 2017. Candidates should have earned a terminal degree or be ABD in Education or closely related field of study. Applicants should have a strong, interdisciplinary approach to Early Childhood Literacy or Elementary Education Methodology which may focus on specific applications related to theoretical constructs in Literacy, Childhood Development, and Classroom Management. Experience in academic instruction and the integration of technology into the classroom is preferred. Opportunity to teach courses in the area of expertise and/or developing new courses is provided. Teaching will consist of up to 24 credits per academic year along with academic advising to students and institutional/community service is expected.
